

INTRODUCTION

Transforming MS for All (TMSFA) is a **not for profit**, multidisciplinary UK community dedicated to improving Multiple Sclerosis (MS) services and outcomes by **addressing the MS Care Paradox** challenges, found by our 70 centre UK MS services and prescribing audit.¹ One key enabler identified was **maximising MS teams' efficiency** and a related deliverable was the creation of a website to facilitate **multidisciplinary communication** and **share best practice**.

Objectives: To update MS Trust 2025 attendees on the features of, and benefits to practice of using, the TMSFA website and MS Community of Practice platform to connect services across ICS's and ICB's sharing local population health approaches across the UK new advances in care and best practice.
Methods: Live interactive demonstration of Community of Practice platform features by the TMSFA Communications Officer and team members; attendees can join the MS Community of Practice.

RESULTS

TMSFA: Curated a collaborative members area on their website for UK MS HCPs. Including a MS service map, a resource hub and a forum to facilitate multi-disciplinary peer support.

The website is intended to be a **single point of contact for the MS community** through which other relevant sites can be accessed with direct links to other sources of information.

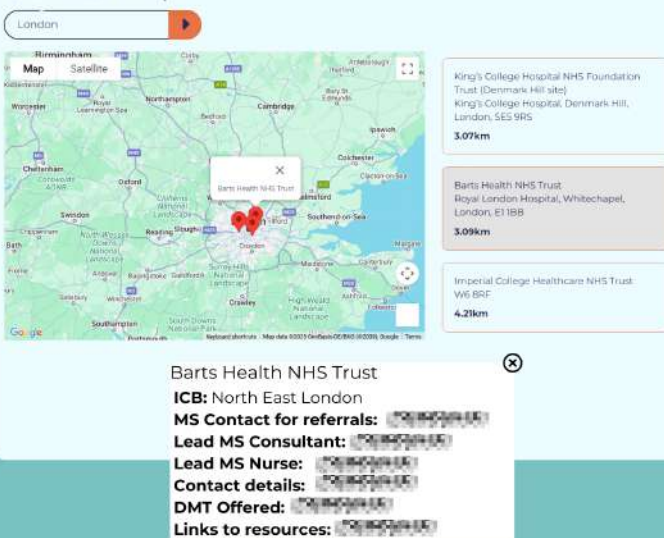
CONCLUSION

TMS4All has developed an interactive website which is becoming the first port of call for HCPs working in MS, by offering resources for the care of individual MS patients, service development and benchmarking one's own services against peers.

CONTEXT

Specialised neurology commissioning is being delegated to Integrated Care Boards (ICBs) to enhance local decision-making.² MS services are likely to vary locally based on population health needs. It is essential that care pathways and multidisciplinary support is executed according to local requirements, ensuring equitable care for those living with MS. There is an opportunity for the UK MS community to **learn collaboratively and share best practices through a Community of Practice**.
