

Outreach Phlebotomy Service Wye Valley NHS Trust

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Aim: "Improving the service delivery and adherence for patients requiring blood monitoring."

Background

- Herefordshire is a large rural county.
- It has a small main hospital with 5 surrounding community hospitals.

Past

Letter and blood form

notification posted to

patient, prompting them

to have bloods obtained.

- All patients with MS requiring blood tests had to go to their GP Practice.
- 600 PWMS living in Herefordshire.
- 2 MS Specialist Nurses & 1 MS OT.

Present

Text or Telephone notification to patient arrange suitable time/place for bloods to be taken.

GP's predominately receiving results and not notifying MS Service and not having specialist knowledge on the DMT.

May have to rely on others for transport.

Reliance on patient to remember to arrange appointment which was variable.

Arranging a suitable timely appointment was challenging due to appointment availability & reluctance of GP's.



100% Adherence to blood monitoring of those who use the phlebotomy service.

Bloods results reviewed in a timely manner and escalated to GP if necessary.

Bloods obtained at location convenient to patient, ie home/work.

Bloods obtained on time as per DMT guidelines.

This would invariably involve negotiating time off work.

Bloods delivered to pathology the same day.

Impact

This meant 100% of patients had to attend their GP surgery

Now 80% use the Outreach
Phlebotomy Service
